

officers fees or public dues, shall deliver or cause to be delivered to such person or persons chargeable with the same, or left at their place of residence, at least thirty days previous to serving or levying such executions, an account of the sum demanded of him, her or them, which shall contain the specific items charged, with an affidavit annexed thereto, that he hath not, nor hath any other person for him, received any part thereof, or satisfaction for the same, to the best of his knowledge and belief.

CHAPTER 257.

An act to incorporate the Library Association of the Mechanical Fire Company. Passed Mar. 16, 1840.
