BALTIMORE CITY—Sheriff of Baltimore county to summon 48 good and lawful men, residents of the city, 10 days before holding city court, to direct the clerk to draw 23 persons to serve as grand jurors, etc. the persons remaining upon original pannel to serve as petit jurors; no person to be summoned more than once in a year, etc. nor until 25 years old, etc.
