SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That the said commissioners shall have power to change the location of said road as laid down in the foregoing section; *provided*, that in their opinion it would be for the benefit of all parties immediately concerned, and of the county at large, to adopt a location for the contemplated road different from that specified in this act. Change of location

CHAPTER 204.

An act to authorise Thomas W. Overly to introduce certain slaves into this State, from the State of Virginia. Passed Mar. 21,
1838.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Thomas W. Overly is hereby authorised to introduce from Virginia, into this State, the following negroes, slaves for life, viz: Charlotte Long, aged about twenty-two years, Nancy Long, aged about twenty years, and her infant child, aged about eighteen months; *provided* said Thomas W. Overly shall in all respects comply with the requisitions of the act of Assembly, passed at December session eighteen hundred and thirty-three, chapter eighty-seven, so far as the same may be applicable. CHAPTER 205.

An act relating to Poor Children in Queen Anne's County. Passed Mar. 22,
1838.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners of the school fund in Queen Ann's county be, and they are hereby authorised and directed to pay over to the trustees of school district number twenty-two, within the limits of which is situated the almshouse of said county, such sum of money in addition to the proportion which the said school district is now entitled to receive, as may be necessary to Compensation for Alms' House children
