CHAPTER 33.

*An act to Incorporate the Leonard Town Steam Mill and Manufacturing Company.* Passed Jan. 24,  
1838.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the persons who shall as hereafter mentioned, become subscribers to the capital stock hereby created and such other persons as shall hereafter become stockholders in the said corporation, are hereby enacted and declared to be a body politic and corporate, by the name and style and title of the Leonard Town Steam Mill and Manufacturing company, and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be able to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, in all courts of law and equity in this State and elsewhere, and to make and have a common seal, and the same to break and alter and renew at their pleasure, and generally to do every act and thing necessary to carry into effect this act, or to promote the object and design of this corporation. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the capital stock of the company shall be twenty thousand dollars, to be divided into eight hundred shares, of twenty five dollars each, with power to the said company to increase the same to one hundred thousand dollars, whenever the president and directors of the said company may determine so to do, the time place and manner of which augmentation shall be subject to the direction and under the control of the said president and directors. SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That William T. Maddox, Thomas H.
