

State or misrepresented the conditions of any insurance policy or contract; whether or not he is indebted to any insurance company or general agent by virtue of any contract as former agent or broker, whether or not his license as insurance agent or broker has been declined or revoked in this or any other State for a violation of law; where and in what business engaged during the past year; *whether such license is sought for the sole purpose of writing insurance on the life of the applicant, relative, employees, co-workers or any other individual risk*, and in addition to such other information as the Insurance Commissioner may require, shall give full answers to the following questions: Do you understand that it is against the laws of this State (a) to act as a broker for any company without license from this department, (b) to misrepresent the conditions of any policy contract, (c) to make any discrimination between citizens of this State in premiums, or to rebate any part of premiums or commissions, or to twist or attempt to twist policies by misrepresentation *and give a definition of rebating and a definition of twisting*. Said application and declaration shall be signed by the person, a member of the copartnership, or a duly authorized officer of the corporation applying as the case may be. If any such license shall be issued for any portion of any year, a ratable sum shall be charged therefor up to the first day of May next succeeding the date of such application.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, and having been passed by a yea and nay vote, supported by three-fifths of all of the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly of Maryland, the same shall take effect from the date of its passage.
