western shore pay to John Eager Howard. Thomas Dixon, Josias Pennington, Thomas M^eEldery, Robert C. Love, Levi Hollingsworth, Daniel Conn, Samuel Sterrett and George Warner, commissioners appointed to superintend the erection of a penitentiary, or to their order, or the order of a majority of them, the sum of twenty thousand dollars, to be applied to that object, as the same shall come into the treasury from the fines, forfeitures, licences and amerciaments, arising within the city and county of Baltimore.

RESOLVED, That the executive of this state be directed to postpone the sale of the following tracts of land, claimed by a certain Ariana French, until the chancellor shall decide between the said Ariana French and the state of Maryland, to wit : Chance, containing one hundred and forty acres ; Choice, seventy-six acres ; Property, one hundred and sixty-eight acres ; Tit for Tat, seventy-three acres ; Blooming Plains, nine hundred and seventy-seven acres ; Durham, three hundred and eighty-four acres ; Rising Sun, two hundred and twenty-five acres ; Tom's Venture, ninety-two acres, and Homony Isle, one hundred and one acres ; provided the said Ariana French, her heirs or assigns, shall make application to the chancellor of this state, according to law, on or before the first day of November next.
