CHAPTER 9.

*A further additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to introduce wholesome water into the city of Frederick.* Passed Jan. 7, 1845.

WHEREAS by an additional supplement to the above re-  
cited act, passed at December session 1839, chapter 210,  
the mayor, aldermen and common council of Frederick  
were appointed commissioners to raise by a scheme or  
schemes of lottery, the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars  
over and above all expenses, charges and interest for the  
purpose of enabling the corporation of Frederick to intro-  
duce a full supply of water into said city; and where-  
as it is represented by the mayor, aldermen and common  
council of Frederick, that the water works purchased by  
the said corporatin not being sufficient to afford a full sup-  
ply of water to the said city, they have made another and  
a different location of such works as will effectuate the said  
object, and are anxious to proceed in the construction of the  
same, but that the proceeds of the lottery authorised as  
aforesaid, and now in a course of drawing, owing to the  
slow sale of the tickets thereof will not afford adequate  
means for the completion of said works as speedily as the  
exigencies of the inhabitants of said city shall require, and  
that a loan on the credit of said corporation will be neces-  
sary to accelerate such completion; and whereas the said  
corporate authorities have further represented that certain  
portions of land ought to be vested in them in perpetuity  
for the construction of a part of said works, either by pur-  
chase or condemnation, and they have therefore prayed  
that a law may be passed to authorise said loan and con-  
demnation—therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the mayor, aldermen and common coun-
