

An act to give further time to William O. Carroll, Sheriff of Montgomery county, to execute all debts and suits in his hands and to give him the same.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That William O. Carroll, late Sheriff of Montgomery county, be and he is hereby allowed until the first day of February in the year eighteen hundred and forty-seven, and that the said bond be executed on or before that day, shall be as valid and binding on said sheriff as if executed within the time now limited by law.

CHAPTER 1.

CHAP. 1.

An act to allow Jacob Grove, former Sheriff of Carroll County, Maryland, further time to complete his collections.

Passed Jan. 2, 1847.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Jacob Grove, former sheriff of Carroll county, shall have further time to complete his collections, until the first day of January, eighteen hundred and forty-eight.
