CHAPTER 313.

An act to divide School District Number Seven, in Anne Arundel County. Passed March 8, 1847.

WHEREAS, it has been represented to this General Assembly, that in consequence of the large size of, and great number of children in, primary school district number seven, of Anne Arundel county, that many persons are deprived of any benefit of its school—Therefore,

Preamble.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners of primary schools for Anne Arundel county be, and they are hereby authorised and required, if in their judgment they shall deem the same necessary, to divide said district, number seven, for the purpose of establishing another school district, to be denominated school district number fifty; and that said school district, when so laid off, shall be placed upon equal footing in all respects with other schools of said county.

CHAPTER 314.

An additional supplement to the act entitled, an act for the better regulation of the Militia of the City of Baltimore. Passed Feb'y 13, 1847.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the general and field officers of the third division be a board, with power to revise the brigade and regimental districts, as the increase of population may require, within the bounds of said division, and to number the new regiments that may thus be created; provided however, that no one of such new districts shall contain less than fifteen hundred enrolled privates.

Field officers to be a board.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the said board shall report their proceedings to the Governor, who shall thereupon issue commissions for the field, staff and company officers for such additional regiments as may be so reported.
