Resolution in favor of the Clerks of the House and Senate.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Treasurer of this State, pay to Eli Duvall, the sum of eight dollars; to John W. Rider, the sum of twenty-four dollars; to Samuel T. Houston, the sum of fifteen dollars; to John T. Jackson, the sum of nineteen dollars; to Joseph B. Smith, the sum of fifteen dollars; to Samuel Reindollar, the sum of twelve dollars; to Benjamin L. Gantt, the sum of nine dollars; to William H. Marshall, the sum of twenty-eight dollars; to Woolman J. Gibson, the sum of fifteen dollars; to Joseph W. Gordon, junior, the sum of fifteen dollars, being the usual amount allowed as itinerant charges of the members of the Legislature.
