Preamble and Resolution for the Repair of certain Arms in the State Armories. March 10,  
1847.

WHEREAS, it appears from the report of the Adjutant General of Maryland, made in obedience to the orders of the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Militia of the State of Maryland, that there are a number of arms in the several State Arsenals unfit for service, but which may be rendered serviceable at a small expense, and thereby enable the executive to gratify, to a considerable extent, the numerous requisitions for arms from uniform Volunteer corps, which he is unable to do from the limited number of arms receivable annually, from the General Government, as the State's quota, under the act of Congress of eighteen hundred and eight—Therefore,

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorised to contract for the repairs of said arms and such others as may from time to time be returned to said Arsenals, upon the most reasonable terms, and that he draw on the treasurer for such sum or sums as may be necessary for the cost and expense thereof, in favor of the person or persons performing such service.*
