Not to interfere with lien law.

SEC. 12. *And be it enacted,* That nothing in this act shall be construed to interfere with any lien law now in force, or which may hereafter be enacted.

CHAPTER 94.

Passed March 13, 1852.

*AN ACT to Discharge and Release Nathaniel Duke from the Payment of a certain Tax therein mentioned.*

Preamble.

WHEREAS, Nathaniel Duke, by reason of the resignation of A. R. Sollers, Clerk of Calvert County Court, before the return of the election in Calvert county was made, was appointed by the Governor Clerk of said court, in order to make the return of said elections, and as such clerk, paid the tax due on his commission as clerk aforesaid; *and whereas,* the said Nathaniel Duke is liable to pay a further tax on his commission, as Clerk of the Circuit Court of Calvert county, which it is not just and right that he should be required to pay. Now, therefore,

Released from payment.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Nathaniel Duke be, and he is hereby discharged and released from the payment of the tax of fifty dollars on his commission, as Clerk of the Circuit Court for Calvert county.
