2. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said Richard Lawrence register the said negro in Baltimore county court, in the same manner as he by law would have been compelled to do, had he brought him into this state within one year after his removal from Delaware as aforesaid.

3. AND BE IT ENACTED, That nothing herein contained shall be construed to enable the said Richard Lawrence to sell or dispose of said slave, until he shall have resided within this state three whole years after the passage of this act, except in cases of disposition by last will and testament, and disposition by law for bona-fide debts or consequent upon intestacy.

*An act for the relief of Susan Rouse, of Caroline county.*

Section 1. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the justices of the levy court of Caroline county be, and they are hereby authorised and directed to assess and levy on the assessable property of said county, so long as they shall see cause, a sum of money not exceeding thirty dollars, for the support and maintenance of Susan Rouse; and that the same be collected and paid annually to the aforesaid Susan Rouse or her order, by the collector of said county, agreeably to the order of the levy court aforesaid.
