An ACT to settle and pay the civil list and other expences of civil government.

Preamble.

WHEREAS those who dedicate their time, abilities and labour, to the public, ought to receive a reasonable and adequate compensation for their services,

II. *Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the following officers of civil government, for the time being, shall be entitled to receive at the rate of the following salaries, in current money, for the ensuing year, to wit: The treasurer of the western shore, six hundred pounds; the treasurer of the eastern shore, one hundred and fifty pounds; the auditor, two hundred pounds; the clerk of the council, two hundred and fifty pounds; the clerk of the senate, thirty pounds; the clerk of the house of delegates, seventy-five pounds; the printer to the state, three hundred and seventy-five pounds; the messenger to the council, fifty pounds.

III. *And be it enacted,* That all monies which shall remain in the treasury after discharging the journal of accounts, and all monies heretofore appropriated to the use of congress, which shall hereafter be received, and all unappropriated money which may come into the treasury, be first applied to the payment of the civil list for the ensuing year.

An ACT to continue the acts of assembly for the inspection of salted provisions exported and imported from and to the town of Baltimore, and for other purposes.

BE it enacted, *by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That an act of assembly, entitled, An act for the inspection of salted provisions exported and imported from and to the town of Baltimore, passed at a session of assembly, begun and held at the city of Annapolis on Monday the sixth day of November, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-six, and one other act of assembly, entitled, A Supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the inspection of salted provisions exported and imported from and to the town of Baltimore, so far as the same is not altered or amended by this act, shall be and is hereby continued, and shall remain in full force to the thirtieth day of October, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven, and to the end of the next session which shall happen thereafter.

II. *And,* whereas the size of the barrels have been found inconvenient to traders, *Be it enacted,* That from and after the first day of March next, it shall and
