MESSAGE TO THE SENATE

HOUSE OF DELEGATES

Annapolis, Md., May 25, 1962.

By Mr. Boone:

Gentlemen of the Senate:

The House of Delegates, pursuant to the Governor's proclamation, has met in Special Session and having organized by the election of the Hon. Perry O. Wilkinson, Speaker and Mr. James P. Mause, Chief Clerk, is now ready to proceed with the business of the Session.
