House Bill No. 107—By Mr. Boone:

AN ACT to add a new Section 39B to Article 88A of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition and 1961 Supplement), title "State Department of Public Welfare", sub-title "Maryland Children's Center", to follow immediately after Section 39A thereof, and to change the said sub-title to "Maryland Children's Center and Southern Regional Detention Center", authorizing the State Department of Public Welfare to establish, maintain and operate a facility to be known as the Southern Regional Detention Center, making provision for the Advisory Board thereof, and relating generally to the establishment, maintenance and operation of the Southern Regional Detention Center, to the care and custody of certain children therein, and to payments and tax levies by the several Counties and Baltimore City for such care.

The Speaker put the question: Shall the bill pass notwithstanding the objections of the Executive?
