III. *And be it enacted*, That on a written agreement being entered into by and between John Nepton and John Seigler, settlers, their heirs or legal representatives, and acknowledged before a justice of the peace for Allegany county, ascertaining the proper proprietor of the lot three thousand seven hundred and forty-six, which agreement being produced to the said register, he is hereby authorized and required to correct the return conformably to the said agreement, and instead of the number erased to insert number three thousand seven hundred and forty-eight, an unappropriated lot, as belonging to the person whose number is erroneously returned.
