Dear Mr. Speaker:

I have today vetoed House Bill No. 741 and in accordance with provisions of Article 2, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I am returning the same to you along with my veto message.

House Bill No. 741 was designed to create a State debt in the amount of \$10,000,000 with the money to be used by the Maryland Port Authority for acquisition of property and improvement to Port facilities.

Senate Bill No. 477, which was identical to House Bill No. 741, was passed by both houses of the General Assembly and was signed into law by me on April 24, 1961. Since the bills are exact duplicates, I believe it is unnecessary to sign this particular House Bill.
