Mr. Griffith from the select committee reported favorably on a bill entitled, an act to authorize and require the County Commissioners for Kent and Queen Anne's counties to levy on their respective counties a sum of money to erect a free bridge over Chester river at a point called Crompton Ferry.

Mr. Stone from the select committee reported favorably on a bill entitled, an act amendatory of an act passed January session 1854, chapter 172, entitled, an act to regulate fisheries in the waters of the Potomac river within the jurisdiction of Maryland and to protect the breed of fish therein;

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the White Hall, Jarrettsville and La Grange Turnpike Company.

Was read the second time,

Three fourths of the members concurring, the said bill was read the third time and rejected for want of a constitutional majority, by yeas and nays follows:
