

INSPECTORS AND INSPECTIONS—

Order adopted, that the committee on Inspections inquire into the expediency of increasing the number of flour Inspectors, 56; unfavorable report, and report adopted, 264.

Order to appoint a committee to enquire into the expediency of abolishing the office of Inspector of Guano, 59; unfavorable report on, 320.

Report of Daniel S. Biser, Inspector General of flour, 92; referred, 93.

Petition, asking a change in the inspection laws of this State, referred, 143.

Leave to bring in a bill to repeal or amend the acts creating and regulating the inspection of Guano in the city of Baltimore, 175.
