

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Phelps, from the select committee to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act for the benefit of William R. Hayward, of Dorchester county, reported the same without amendment;

Read the second time by special order, passed and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Phelps, from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to provide for the sale of the Nanticoke bridge, toll house and lot at Vienna, in Dorchester county, reported that the said bill ought not to pass;

Which was read and concurred in.

Mr. Risteau submitted the following resolution:

It being represented and shewn to this General Assembly, that Esther Henry, an Indian annuitant of Maryland, died intestate in the year eighteen hundred and twenty-eight, leaving three sons living at the time of her death, her only descendants and heirs at law, viz: Thomas Henry, James Henry and Washington Henry, of whom the said Thomas and Washington have since died intestate and without issue, and the said James Henry has also since died intestate, leaving Ellen Henry, his only child and heir at law, now residing in Baltimore, yet under the age of twenty-one years, who is considered entitled to one-third of the annuity of her grand mother—therefore,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay to Joseph Ennalls, of Dorchester county, for the use of said Ellen Henry, the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, being the arrears of so much of the said annuity from the first of January, eighteen hundred and twenty-eight, to the first of January, eighteen hundred and forty-three.

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, assented to and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Crookshanks reported a bill entitled, an act to prevent swine and geese from going at large in the village of Cecilton and its vicinity, in Cecil county;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Sherwood of Talbot, from the select committee to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act directing the commissioners of the tax for Talbot county to publish annually a summary statement of their receipts and disbursements, reported the same without amendment;

Read the second time by special order, passed and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Taylor reported a bill entitled, an act to allow David G. Odell, former sheriff of Worcester county, further time to complete his collections;
