

Precincts One, Two, Three, Five to Nine, inclusive, and Eleven to Sixteen, inclusive, in Ward Fifteen; and of the area within Ward Sixteen; and of the area within Precincts One to Twelve, inclusive, and within Precincts Sixteen, Seventeen, and Eighteen, and within Precincts Twenty-one to Twenty-five, inclusive, of Ward Number Twenty; and of the area within Precincts Seventy-eight to Ninety-four, inclusive, and of Precincts Ninety-eight and of Precincts One Hundred to One Hundred Five, inclusive of Ward Number Twenty-seven; and of the area within Ward Number Twenty-eight."

and in Line 24 on Page 5, after the following "2 Senators." add the following:

"The Sixth Legislative District is composed of the area within Ward Eighteen and Ward Nineteen and of the area within Precincts Thirteen, Fourteen, Fifteen, Nineteen, and Twenty in Ward Twenty and of the area within Wards Twenty-one, Twenty-two, Twenty-three, Twenty-four and Twenty-five."
