

now providing for the apportionment of representation in the House of Delegates and in the Senate of Maryland; providing for the apportionment, membership, and election of members of the House of Delegates and of the Senate, and for the districts which are to be the basis of representation in each of the two Houses; imposing certain duties upon the Governor of Maryland in relation to such apportionment, representation, and districts; providing for the effect of this Act upon certain sections in Article 3 of the Constitution of Maryland; providing for contingencies whereby part or all of this Act becomes no longer effective; and relating generally to apportionment and representation in the House of Delegates and in the Senate of Maryland, to the election of members thereof, and to the duties of certain State officers in relation thereto.
