Any requirements of Section 42B and 42C applicable to sub-districting shall not be applicable in any county or Baltimore City which determines not to be subdivided or further subdivided.”

Amendment No. 2—Strike out all of Subsections (a), (a-1), (a-2), (b) and (c) of Section 42E on Pages 4, 5, 6 and 7 of the third reading file bill and insert in lieu thereof the following:
