Notwithstanding the provisions of this subsection if any Senatorial District is entitled to elect more than three Senators, one of the Senators may be nominated by and elected by the voters of the entire Senatorial District. If the subdistricting of any Senatorial District has not been accomplished by April 1, 1966, by act of the General Assembly, the Governor of Maryland by proclamation shall forthwith determine the number and the boundaries of the subdistricts but not later than May 1, 1966."
