INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

Senate Resolution No. 12—By Senator Hodges:

Senate Resolution requesting the Governor of Maryland and the Mayor of Baltimore City to redesignate a tract of land in Baltimore City surrounding the War Memorial Plaza as "War Memorial Plaza."

WHEREAS, The area bounded by Lexington, Gay, Fayette, and Holliday Streets has been known, recognized, and called War Memorial Plaza, or Memorial Plaza; and

WHEREAS, This Plaza is directly adjacent to the War Memorial Building; and

WHEREAS, Under Ordinance No. 517, Section 5, it reads "And Be it Further Ordained, That a joint Memorial other than a building, be, and the same is, hereby authorized to be erected by the City of Baltimore, and the State of Maryland, on the tract of land bounded by Holliday, Gay, Lexington, and Fayette Streets. The plans of said Memorial to be approved by the Art Commission of Baltimore City and to harmonize with the plans of the Memorial Building hereinbefore to be erected; and

WHEREAS, The greater Baltimore Committee, Inc., and the Committee for Downtown, Inc. have had brochures authorized and printed, reading "The Inner Harbor and City Hall Plaza"; now, therefore be it

Resolved by the Senate of Maryland, That the Senate of Maryland requests the Governor of Maryland and the Mayor of Baltimore City to immediately proclaim the tract of land bounded by Holliday, Gay, Lexington, and Fayette Streets, and surrounding the War Memorial Plaza as "War Memorial Plaza"; and be it further

Resolved, That the Secretary of the Senate be instructed to send copies of this Resolution to the Department Commander of the V. F. W., the Maryland Congressional members, State and City officials, newspapers, radio and television stations, and to the Allied Veterans Organizations.
