

**MINUTES OF THE SENATE OF MARYLAND RESOLVED
INTO A COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE HOUSE**

Annapolis, Maryland, October 12, 1965.

The Senate resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole House for the consideration of bills pertaining to apportionment.

The President presided in compliance with order adopted in Regular Session.

The President ruled that apportionment bills would be considered in numerical order.

The first bills to be considered were Senate Bill No. 1 and Senate Bill No. 2 which were classed as companion Bills.
