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**House Bill No. 462—Caroline County—Tax Exemptions**

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Subsections (11) and (40) of Section 9 of Article 81 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1965 Replacement Volume), title "Revenue and Taxes," subtitle "What Shall Be Taxed and Where," providing that for county purposes in Caroline County farm implements and livestock shall be exempt from assessment and taxation.
