House Bill No. 176—By Delegates Curran and Jensen.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 532 of the Charter and Public Local Laws of Baltimore City (1949 Edition, being Article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland), title "Baltimore City," subtitle "Police Department of Baltimore City," as last amended by Chapter 203 of the Acts of 1966; to provide that the Accident Investigation Division of the Baltimore City Police Department shall furnish copies of reports relating to any accident to all persons other than an agency of the State or any subdivision thereof, upon payment of a fee, and setting the fee to be charged.
