Which was read the first and by special order the second time, assented to and sent to the senate.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners of Harford county, be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to take into their consideration the claim of James A. Wilson, of Harford county, for taking care of James Hambleton, in a severe illness, and that the said commissioners shall have power to levy upon the assessable property of said county, such sum of money as they may allow the said James A. Wilson, and that the same be collected and paid over to the said Willson on his order, as other levies are made collected and paid over.

Mr. Stansbury asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, an act for the recovery of stray stock, viz: horses, horned cattle, sheep and hogs;

Referred to Messrs. Stansbury, Poultney and Welch.

On motion of Mr. Berry,

Whereas, the honorable Clement Dorsey is desirous to make the compilation of the laws of this State more valuable by including the acts of the present session;

Therefore ordered, that the clerk of this house furnish him from time to time with a copy of all laws (which may originate in this house) of a general or public local nature, during the present session.

Mr. Giles asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to permit Doctor Andrew A. Lynch to bring into this State, his servant man, aged about 22 years;

Referred to the committee on the colored population.

Mr. Newman asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, an act to authorise commissioners to be appointed for that purpose, to raise a sum of ten thousand dollars by lottery, to be applied to the building of an academy, in the town of Frostburg, and a market house and town-hall in Cumberland.

Referred to Messrs. Newman, Price and Berry.

Mr. Newman submitted the following order:

Ordered, That the committee on internal improvement be directed to require the president of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to report to this house forthwith, whether he deems it important to the interest of the State, that an appropriation should be made to said canal, during the present session of the legislature;

Which was read.
