Mr. Giles presented the petition of A. Hyam, praying relief in the matter therein named;

Read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Also, the petition of Susan Galloway, of the city of Baltimore, praying to be divorced from her husband Vincent Galloway;

Read and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. Stansbury presented the petition of Nathan Fitzpatrick, of Baltimore county, a soldier of the revolution, praying to be placed on the pension roll of Maryland;

Read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Also, the petition of Louis H. Gouley, of the city of Baltimore, praying to be divorced from his wife, Mary Gouley;

Read and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. Giles presented the memorial of Francis H. Smith & Co., praying that the law relating to foreign corporations and their agencies in this State may not pass;

Read and laid on the table.

Mr. McPherson presented the memorial of 34 citizens of Frederick county, praying the passage of a law to reorganize the militia of this State;

Read and referred to the committee on militia.

Mr. Simmons presented the memorial of 51 citizens of Frederick county, praying the repeal of the law, entitled, an act to establish magistrates' courts in the several counties in this State, and that concurrent jurisdiction be given to magistrates with the county courts in all cases of simple debt;

Read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Potter presented the petition of 96 citizens of Caroline county, praying for the repeal of the school law of said county, passed in 1838;

Read and referred to the committee already raised on that subject.
