

The bill, entitled, an act to make valid a deed from Henry Laman and Feana his wife, to Jacob Otto ;

Endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment :"

Amendment proposed.

Insert after the word "purposes" the following : "as if the said grantors had been naturalized citizens at the time of its execution."

Read the second time and laid on the table.

And the bill entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of a sworn interpreter to the Baltimore city court and Baltimore county court ;

Endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments."

Amendments proposed.

Strike out in the preamble of the bill from the word "courts" in the third line to the word "therefor," in the seventh line.

Strike out the words the "Governor of this State, by and with the consent of the Senate," and insert "Baltimore county court and Baltimore city court shall each of them."

In the third line after the word "German" insert "French."

In the fifth line strike out "Baltimore city court and Baltimore county court," and insert "said courts."

After the word "office," sixth line strike out the word "and," in the seventh line, and insert "during the pleasure of the court by which he is appointed."

Read the first and by special order the second time and dissented from.

And delivered a bill, entitled, an act relating to the trustees and governors of Cokesbury College ;

Endorsed "will pass."

Read and referred to the committee on education.

And a bill, entitled, a further supplement to the act, entitled, an act, directing the manner of suing out attachments in this province, and limiting the extent of them—Endorsed "will pass."

Read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Le Grand submitted the following message :

*House of Delegates, March 17, 1840.*

*Gentlemen of the Senate :*

We herewith respectfully return the bill for the appointment of an interpreter with the proposed amendments, and most respectfully ask that your honorable body will reconsider the proposed amendments, and pass the bill in its original form ;

Which was read, assented to and sent to the senate.

Mr. Giles submitted the following message :

*House of Delegates, March 17th, 1840.*

*Gentlemen of the Senate :*

We herewith return to your honorable body a bill for the relief of George Y. Kelso, with the request that you will reconsider and pass the same ; as this is a peculiar case and Mr. Kelso has no relief under the general law passed at this session ;
