

The bill, entitled, an act to repeal an act to incorporate the Carroll county Lyceum in Westminster;

The bill entitled, an act to punish certain trespasses in and near the city of Baltimore;

The bill entitled, an act to repeal the several acts passed December session 1839, authorising the granting of lotteries;

The bill entitled, an act supplemental to an act entitled, an act respecting the equity jurisdiction of county courts;

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act to regulate the manner of taking testimony in cases in equity, passed at the session of 1836, chapter 128;

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Rockville academy;

The bill entitled, an act supplemental to the act entitled, an act concerning crimes and punishments, passed at November session 1809, chapter 138;

The bill entitled, an act to divorce Elizabeth Knight, from her husband James Knight;

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the erection of a bridge across Mattawoman swamp between Charles and Prince George's counties;

The bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act directing the manner of suing out attachments in this province and limiting the extent of them;

The bill entitled, an act to divorce Harriet Lydia Storer, from her husband Solomon Storer;

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the village of Jacksonville in Cecil county;

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Christian Tabler, of Berkely county in the State of Virginia;

The bill entitled, an act relating to the trustees of school district No. 4, called Mountain district in Frederick county;

The bill entitled, an act to give to the Chancellor and the county courts as courts of equity jurisdiction in cases of divorce;

The bill entitled, an act declaratory of the law authorising the closing of judgments in the several county courts of this State;

And the bill entitled, an act to authorise the drawing of a lottery for the establishment of a female seminary in Prince George's county;

Severally read the second time and will not pass, and returned to the senate.
