

Mr. Jones of Somerset presented the memorial of John S. Crockett, late sheriff and collector of Somerset county, praying the passage of an act to extend the time for the completion of his collections;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Jones of Somerset, Williams, Rider and Parsons.

Mr. Brent presented the petition of 79 citizens of Charles county, praying that the tobacco warehouse therein mentioned may be made a State inspection warehouse;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Brent, Bowling and Matthews.

Mr. Richardson presented the petition of sundry citizens of Frederick county, praying for a law to authorise the levy court of said county to levy a sum of money to aid in building a bridge across Fishing creek, at or near Lewistown;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Richardson, Motter and Wm. Lynch.

Mr. Ford presented the report of the trustees of the Churchill Academy, in Queen Anne's county;

Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

Mr. Ford also presented the memorial of the trustees of the poor of Queen Anne's county, in relation to the keeping of lunatic paupers in the Maryland Hospital;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Gantt presented the petition of sundry citizens of Anne Arundel county, praying the passage of a law creating a new school district therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Gantt, Estep and Dorsey.

Mr. Gantt also presented the petition of Jacob Jeanes, praying to be divorced from his wife, Eliza Jeanes;

Which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. Tall presented the petition of sundry citizens of Dorchester county, praying the passage of an act authorising the raising, by lottery, a sufficient sum of moneys to connect the waters of the Chop-tank and Black Water rivers;

Which was read and referred to the committee on lotteries.

Mr. Tall also presented two petitions of sundry citizens of Dorchester county, praying the passage of a law to regulate the height of fences in said county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Tall, Frazier and Keene.

And Mr. Nesbitt presented the petition of 70 citizens of Pleasant Valley district, in Washington county, praying that the charter for the improvement of the public road from the city of Frederick to Harper's Ferry, granted in the year 1823, ch. 142, may be revoked, or a certain toll-gate thereon be removed;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.
