

SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 27, 1841.

The house met. Present at the call of the roll, the following members:

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The Speaker announced the following message as having been received from the Senate on yesterday:

The bill, entitled an act for the benefit of Joseph Knox, of Washington county;

Also the bill, entitled an act to change the place of holding elections in the 5th or Parsons' district, in Worcester county;

Also the bill, entitled an act concerning the Franklin Rail Road;

Also the bill, entitled an act regulating the licenses of hawkers and pedlars, and for other purposes;

Also the bill, entitled an act to allow William Ireland, late collector of Calvert county, further time to complete his collections;

Also the bill, entitled an act to authorise and empower Thomas Perry, former sheriff and collector of Charles county, to complete his collections;

Also the bill, entitled an act to authorise the commissioners of the tax of Anne Arundel county to pay over to the commissioners of the tax of Howard District whatever sum or sums of money may be due from Anne Arundel county to Howard District;

And the bill, entitled an act to authorise the trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church on Liberty circuit, to hold certain property therein mentioned,

Severally endorsed "will pass," and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed.

Also the bill, entitled an act to incorporate the Morning Star Lodge, No. 20, of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, in the town of Havre de Grace;

Endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment;"

Which amendment was read the first, and by a special order the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed;

And delivered the following bills, originated in and passed by the Senate, viz.

A bill, entitled an act for the more effectual collection of taxes in Allegany county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Thayer, Coombs and Sprigg of Allegany;

A bill, entitled an act to incorporate the Mount Etna Springs Company, in Washington and Frederick counties;
