Which were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Tuck, chairman of the committee on grievances and courts of justice, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate, entitled an act to make valid certain deeds;

Which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.
