Mr. Hooper presented the petition of Charles Parker, William S. B. Cottman and others, securities on the bond of John C. Hardy, praying to be released from the payment of the interest due on said bond;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Hooper, Cathell, Hearn, Jones of Somerset, and Williams.

Mr. Frazier, presented the petition of Thomas H. Hooper, of Dorchester county, praying to be remunerated for the transportation of two pieces of artillery to Cambridge, in said county;

Which was read and referred to the committee on claims.
