

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time and concurred in.

The engrossed bills of the House of Delegates from No. 1 to No. 30 inclusive and from No. 38 to No. 52 inclusive; also the engrossed resolutions from No. 1 to No. 10 inclusive.

And severally read, assented to and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate returned the said bills and resolutions: Severally endorsed, read and assented to.

And delivered the engrossed bills of the senate from No. 41 to 55 inclusive and from No. 63 to No. 81 inclusive.

Which were severally read, assented to, and returned to the senate.

A resolution from the senate being announced, Messrs. Ely and Howard members of that body, appeared within the bar of the house and informed the Speaker that his Excellency, the Governor, was attending in the Senate Chamber, and requested the attendance of the house to see him sign and seal the laws.

The Speaker left the chair, and attended by the members of the house, went to the Senate Chamber and there presented the engrossed bills to the Governor, to which the great seal had been previously attached, who signed the same in the presence of both houses.

The Speaker with the rest of the members returned and remained the chair.

The house adjourned until tomorrow morning 8 o'clock.

WEDNESDAY April 7 1841

The house met: Present the same members as on yesterday.

Mr. Casan submitted the following order, which was concurred in and adopted:

Ordered, That the House of Delegates stand adjourned on Monday last at 8 o'clock P. M.

In conformity with the arrangement resolved upon on Monday last, the House of Delegates, jointly with the Senate, this day proceeded by the way of the Annapolis and Elk Ridge Rail Road, to the city of Washington, and attended the funeral of William Henry Harrison and the President of the United States.

The house adjourned until the next day.
