

Mr. Boyle reported unfavorably on a bill, entitled an act to lay out and construct a road from Eldersburg, in Carroll county, or some point near Eldersburg, to Reisterstown, and from thence to a point at or near Saint John's Church, on the Dover road, in Baltimore county;

Which were severally read the first time, and severally ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Tuck, chairman of the committee on grievances and courts of justice, made a favorable report upon the following bills from the Senate:

The bill, entitled an act to authorise the commissioners of Cecil county to issue writs of citation and attachment in certain cases;

The bill, entitled an act to quiet possessions, confirm titles and make valid certain proceedings in Chancery;

The bill, entitled a further supplement to an act, entitled an act directing the manner of suing out attachments in this Province, and limiting the extent of them;

The bill, entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act to record and make valid a deed therein mentioned, passed at December session 1839, ch. 244; and

The bill, entitled an act to authorise testimony to be perpetuated in the case therein mentioned;

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Nesbitt, from the select committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate, entitled an act to allow William H. Fitzhugh, late sheriff of Washington county, further time to complete his collections;

Mr. Jones of Somerset, from the select committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate, entitled a further supplement to an act passed December session 1838, ch. 394, entitled an act for the promotion of education in Somerset county; and

Mr. Williams, chairman of the select committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate, entitled an act for the better regulation of ferries in Somerset county, and for other purposes;

Which were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Sprigg of Allegany, chairman of the select committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate, entitled an act for the relief of John Lewellyn, of Allegany county;

Which was read.

The said bill was then read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed and returned to the senate.

Mr. Thayer, from the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled an act for the relief of the securities of Israel Mayberry, late collector of the taxes for Allegany county, reported the same with the following amendment:
