

A Court held for the County of Somerset in the Province of Maryland by their Majesties Justices of the Peace thereunto appointed the 13th day of August Anno Domini 1695

Present in the Court the Justices the Honorable Mr. Tho: Dixon, Mr. Jam: Hooper, Mr. Geo: Layfield, Mr. Geo: King, Mr. Stephen Hooper, Mr. Daniel Wray.

Their Majesties advise that John Vpscott came to appear at the Court to answer to their Majesties the indictment against him for the same.

De Vpscott appearing upon Examination did produce the following Certificate. (viz). These presents may certify all persons whom it concerns that John Vpscott & Mary Thomas were joynt together in Matrimony according to the form of the Church of England & the Customs of Virginia the 19th day of July 1695 by us the Court.

Ordered that John Vpscott give security for his good behav^r & appearance next Court. Whereupon came the said Vpscott & did two securities viz. for James Henricson & the said Vpscott did acknowledge himself to owe and be indebted to their Majesties the sum of 50 Sterling the said James Henricson in the sum of 25th like money aforesaid all & us to be levied on their goods & Chables Land & to come in for their Majesties next Court.

The Condition of whose Recognizance is such that if the above bound John Vpscott be of the good behav^r & appearance to all their Majesties Judges & Justices of the Province but more especially to the Honorable Mr. Tho: Dixon who shall appear at the next Court held for the County of Somerset & do pay the said 50 Sterling to be levied otherwise to be & remain in full power force & virtue.

Their Majesties advise that Rose Mason, till she give security for her appearance next Court to answer to their Majesties the indictment against her.

Whereupon came Thomas Quilliam Off Recognizance did acknowledge himself to owe & be indebted to their Majesties the sum of 15 Sterling money of England & us to be levied on the goods & Chables Land.

The Condition of whose Recognizance is such that if the above bound Thomas Quilliam do so forth coming Rose Mason aforesaid she shall appear before the Justices to answer as aforesaid then the recognizance to be void, or else remain in force & virtue.

And John Fisher this day was sworn Deputy Clerk of this Court.

The List of Assembly was this day published in open Court.

By the Order of the Govern^r the 28th May 1695
Ordered that the Justices of the Court within the Province finish & determine all Causes now depending in the Court, either this next June Court or in August Court after at farthest, under the pain & peril that may fall thereon, & that the Sheriff Cause this Order to be read in open Court.
