And be it enacted, That the said John Spears, shall in every instance, before he shall proceed to the aforesaid collection, make affidavit before some justice of the peace for Anne Arundel county, that the same remains unpaid, and that he hath not received any security or satisfaction for the same, or any part thereof, more than the credits allowed thereon.

The second section in the bill, to be the third.

And the bill entitled, an act to authorise Benjamin T. Pindle, collector of the first collection district of Anne Arundel county, to complete his collections of county taxes in the said district;

Insert after 3d section,

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That the said Benjamin T. Pindle shall in every instance, before he shall proceed to the aforesaid collection, make affidavit, before some justice of the peace for Anne Arundel county, that the same remains unpaid, and that he hath not received any security or satisfaction for the same or any part thereof, more than the credits allowed thereon.
