And be it enacted, That this law shall take effect after the Eastern Shore has given sufficient security for her part of the State tax until the State debt is liquidated, and that the security shall be approved of by the Governor and Treasurer of the Western Shore ;

On motion of Mr. Forwood,

The following amendment was read as a substitute for the amendment submitted by Mr. Schley :

And be it enacted, That all the interest the State of Maryland now has in the Delaware and Chesapeake Canal shall be vested in the Eastern Shore of Maryland, and all the right, title, claim and interest of the Western Shore in and to the said canal shall forever cease, and the Eastern Shore of Maryland, so soon as this act shall become a law according to the provisions of the first section of this act, shall have the sole right to the interest the State of Maryland now has in said Canal ;

On the question being put,

Will the House accept the said substitute ?
