Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Secretary of State be instructed to cause to be printed in two of the daily newspapers of the city of Baltimore, and in one paper in each county where a paper may be published, all the laws and joint resolutions passed at the present session referring to the assessment and collection of the direct tax.

And be it resolved, That such publication shall be continued for one week, and that the Treasurer of the Western Shore is hereby authorised to pay at the usual rate for the same.

Which was read assented to, and sent to the Senate.
