

A resolution authorizing the Adjutant General to dispose of certain military stores ;

Read the first time and referred to the committee on the Militia.

And a bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, a supplement to an act to quiet possessions and prevent suits at law, passed at December session 1839, chapter 34 ;

Read the first time and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

On motion of Mr. Owens of Anne Arundel,

Leave was granted to the committee on Ways and Means to bring in a bill entitled, an act to raise additional revenue to aid in paying the debts of the State by laying a tax on salaries, incomes, emoluments and profits.

On motion of Mr. Spencer,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Spencer, Hollman, Grove and Lyday to bring in a bill for the relief of William H. Fitzhugh, former collector of Washington county.

On motion of Mr. Morsell,

The House took up the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Mary Ann Carr of Calvert county.

The question being on assenting to the amendment from the Senate ;

And on being put,

It was assented to, and ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Spencer reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of William H. Fitzhugh, former collector of Washington county ;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Nicols of Caroline,

The House took up the bill entitled, an act to abolish the office of Judge of the Land Office of the Eastern Shore, and for other purposes ;

Read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Richardson of Baltimore submitted the following resolution :

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the several generals, colonels, lieutenant colonels, majors, captains and other commanding officers of the militia of the State of Maryland be, and they are hereby required to furnish to the Adjutant General a full and correct list of all arms, accoutrements and equipments now in their possession, or for which they may have at any time given bond and security to the State, and to return to the Adjutant General at Annapolis all said arms, accoutrements and equipments which may not be in use or required for service by their respective commands ;

Which was read, assented to and sent to the Senate.

The House then took up the following bills :
