The Speaker laid before the house the following letter from William Grason, late Governor of this State :

Annapolis, January 7, 1842.

Sir :—At the commencement of my official term, the sum of four thousand dollars was appropriated by the Legislature, and placed at my disposal, for the purchase of such articles of furniture as might be required at the Government House. Two thousand seven hundred dollars and eighty-five cents have been laid out for that purpose, and the balance of the appropriation, amounting to twelve hundred and ninety-nine dollars and fifteen cents, remains in the Treasury.

The House of Delegates will oblige me, by appointing a committee to examine my account while I am at the seat of government, that I may give any explanations that may be required.
