

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

On motion of Mr. Hollman,

Leave was granted Messrs. Hollman, Weber, Mann, Wade and Boteler, to bring in a bill to incorporate the officers and members of Aaron Lodge No. 33, of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows in the town of Williamsport.

Mr. Curley reported a bill entitled, an act for the incorporation of Union Lodge No. 16, of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows ;

Mr. Curley also, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Powhattan Tribe No 5, of the Independent Order of Red Men of the State of Maryland ;

Mr. Smith reported a bill entitled, an act to regulate the height of fences in election district number two, in Allegany county, and for other purposes ;

Mr. Fitzpatrick reported a bill entitled a supplement to an act entitled, an act to revive and amend an act entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation and improvement of the town of Cumberland, in Allegany county, and to incorporate the same, passed at December session 1834, ch 237 ;

Mr. Chapman, chairman of the committee on Corporations, reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise the burgess and commissioners of the town of Jerusalem, commonly called Funks town, in Washington county, to open such streets and alleys in said town, which have been closed up according to the plat thereof, as they may deem expedient and to the interest of all the citizens of the town, and

Mr. Ghiselin, chairman of the committee on Colored Population, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to authorise Henry M. Jamison to bring a certain negro into Maryland ;

Which said bills were severally read the first and by a special order the second time, severally passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Carroll, chairman of the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to punish certain trespasses in and near the city of Baltimore, reported the same with the following amendments.

Ameadments proposed :

In the 2nd line of the 1st section, after the word "unlawfully," insert "enter any enclosure."

In the 2nd section 3rd line, after the word "exceeding," strike out the word "fifty," and insert "twenty."

Which were read and assented to.

The said bill was then read the second time, by a special order, passed with the proposed amendments, and returned to the Senate.
