So the resolution was assented to and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Lackland submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the State Librarian, be authorised and directed to furnish the Port Deposit Library Association, in Cecil county, with a copy of Dorsey's Laws of Maryland: provided, he has a sufficient number of copies on hand for the use of the State Library, and can furnish the same out of the surplus copies.

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Hopewell submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That for the purpose of carrying into effect the resolution of December session 1841, number 11, directing the Librarian to perform certain duties, that His Excellency the Governor, be authorised to pay out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury, such sums of money, as may be necessary under the said resolution to defray the expenses incurred in the exchange of surplus books, documents, &c., with the agents of foreign countries, may from time to time be authorised by the joint committee on the Library.

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Ligon,

The House took up for consideration the bill reported by him, entitled, an act relating to the collection of county taxes in Howard District;

The said bill was then read the second time, passed, and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Carroll,

The House resumed the consideration of the bill reported by him, entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties passed at December session 1815, chapter 48.

Mr. Stephenson moved to amend said bill by adding at the end thereof the following proviso:

“Provided, That if the said company claims the benefit of this act, then said company shall not charge tolls on more than ten miles of said road, nor shall the said company charge more than half the amount of toll authorised by their original charter.”
