So the resolution was assented to, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Stewart, submitted the following resolution,

“Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the State, pay to any member of the Legislature that may be detained at the seat of government, by indisposition after the adjournment, the same per diem, for every day he may be so detained as if the Legislature were in session.”

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Hearn, chairman of the committee on the Militia, submitted the following resolution,

“Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Adjutant General, be, and he is hereby directed to furnish to the order of Captain William H. Watson, one hundred white waist belts, and twenty-five sergeants Swords for the use of the Independent Blues, of the city of Baltimore, upon the usual conditions.”

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Shriver,

Ordered, That it be entered upon the journal that the following are the amendments, which were proposed and read by Mr. Stewart, from Dorchester, to the bill, submitted by Mr. Johnson, of Anne Arundel, “entitled an act to provide for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland, and for other purposes.”

“And be it enacted, That Richard B. Carmichael, John G. Chapman, Jacob Markell and William T. Wootten, be, and they are hereby appointed agents to represent this State, in all future meetings of the stockholders of all Joint Stock Companies, in which the State has an interest, and the said agents are hereby empowered and directed to execute and discharge on behalf of the State, all and singular the duties required from the agents, appointed by virtue of the act of December session, 1840, chapter 155, to represent the State in said companies, and the said agents are hereby appointed to perform the said duties for the term of three years, and until their successors are appointed and qualified, and upon the death, removal from the State, refusal to serve, or disqualification of any of said agents, the Governor of Maryland is hereby authorised and empowered to nominate, and by and
