

Mr. Smith presented the petition of Charles Perry, praying for a special act, to authorise him to bring into this State, certain slaves therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Colored Population.

Mr. Levering presented two memorials, signed by W. C. Snyder, Jacob Hoff, W. H. Oler, Lewis Turner and thirty-six others, praying the passage of a law, making riotous and outrageous acts committed within five miles of the city of Baltimore, a misdemeanor, punishable by fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the court, according to the aggravated circumstances of the case; and

Mr. Stansbury of Baltimore county, presented a memorial of seventy citizens of Baltimore county, on the same subject;

Which were severally read and referred to the delegations of Baltimore county and city.

Mr. Levering presented the memorial of German citizens of the city of Baltimore, praying the passage of a law directing a certain number of copies of the laws to be printed in the German language;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Printing.

Mr. Smith presented the petition of Archibald McNeil, Thomas Perry, Robert Read, William V. Buskirk, and one hundred and fifty-nine other citizens of Allegany county, asking legislative aid to cure the defects of magistrates in cases of superdeas in Allegany county;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Waters, of Somerset, presented the petition of John Allen, of Caroline county, praying for an act to enable him as executor of Job Allen, deceased, to sell the real estate of said deceased;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Causin presented the petition of John C. Le Grand, John H. T. Magruder, and James S. Owens, asking compensation for work done under resolution No. 1, of December Session, 1842;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Claims.

The Speaker laid before the House, the report of the inspector of State Tobacco warehouse No. 3;

Also, a statement of the clerk of Worcester county court, relative to monies paid into the Treasury of the State within the year ending on the 30th, November.

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means; and

A report from the clerk of Worcester county court, relative to the attendance of judges;
