Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Gallagher, chairman of the committee on Corporations, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Central Baltimore College ;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Education.

Mr. Buckley from the select committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to declare certain offences, misdemeanors, and to provide for the punishment of the same ;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Crimes and Punishments.

Also, a bill entitled, an act relating to the fees of the clerks and registers of wills of the several counties of the State, of Howard District, and of the city court of Baltimore, and of the clerk of the Court of Appeals, whose term of service has expired by constitutional limitation on the 1st of February, 1845 ;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Poik from the select committee, to whom was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate the Mutual Fire Insurance company, in Harford county, passed December session 1842, made a favorable report on said bill ;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The hour having arrived for taking up the order of the day,

The House resumed the consideration of the bill reported by Mr. Johnson, of Frederick, entitled, an act to provide for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland, and for other purposes.

The question before the House being upon the motion of Mr. Archer, to strike out the enacting clause of the bill.

After debate thereon,

Mr. Fooks, moved the previous question, which being demanded by a majority of the members present, the said previous question was put, that is, "shall the main question be now put ?" and it was resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put,

"Will the House strike out the enacting clause of the bill ?"

Determined in the negative.
